

# Information on the processing of personal data in accordance with article 13 of the Regulation 2016/679 (GDPR) for the ENES DATA SPACE

This information notice is addressed to those who are interested in accessing and using the **ENES DATA SPACE** ("User" or "Data Subject"), which delivers an open, scalable and cloud-enabled data science environment for climate data analysis. The Platform was originally funded by the EU as a part of the EGI-ACE Project and is now an asset of EOSC Beyond Project ("Project").

We would also like to ensure you that all your personal data will be processed in full compliance with the GDPR.

### 1. Data controller and DPO

The Data Controller is the CMCC Foundation, with registered office in Lecce (LE) - 73100, via Marco Biagi, 5, e-mail: <u>privacy@cmcc.it</u>, pec: <u>cmcc@pec.cmcc.it</u> and telephone number: +39 0832 1902411, represented by its President *pro tempore*.

The Data Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer, whose email address is <u>dpo@cmcc.it</u>. Any requests for clarification regarding the processing of data or to exercise the rights recognized by the

Any requests for clarification regarding the processing of data or to exercise the rights recognized by the GDPR or to obtain clarification, may be conveyed through the aforementioned channels.

### 2. Personal data categories

The categories of personal data processed may include your name, surname, country, community user identifier, preferred username and user entitlement. In addition, the login timestamp information will be added.

Particularly, Fondazione CMCC will process:

- Community User Identifier and preferred username for statistical purposes;
- · User entitlement to deal with security aspects related to the service;
- All other received data will not be processed nor stored.

The ENES Data Space is leveraging the EGI Check-in service for authentication.

### 3. Purposes and legal basis

The processing of the username is necessary for scientific research purposes in accordance with Article 89 (1) based on Union or Member State law which shall be proportionate to the aim pursued, respect the essence of the right to data protection and provide for suitable and specific measures to safeguard the fundamental rights and the interests of the data subjects.

The processing of other personal data may be necessary to follow up the requests of datasets by the users. In this case, personal data will be carried out in accordance with Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR.

### 4. Duration of the processing activities

We will retain the data for the duration required to implement the Project (that will last until 31/3/2027) and fulfil any related obligations, including reporting to the EU authority (possibly 5 years after the conclusion of the Project). As soon as our obligations permit, we will delete and/or anonymise and/or aggregate all personal data.

Nonetheless, we will retain your data as long as the ENES DATA SPACE is active, unless you decide to withdraw your participation.

### 5. Recipients of personal data and Data Processors

The data processing activities are carried out by the CMCC Foundation and their duly instructed and authorized personnel. We guarantee maximum confidentiality towards the data and employ adequate security measures.



Your personal data may also be communicated to other Project's partners third parties (e.g., technical service providers, hosting providers, IT companies etc.). These parties may be appointed as Data Processors pursuant to Article 28 of the GDPR.

We will not transfer personal data outside the EU.

## 6. Rights of Data Subjects

Data subjects have the right to obtain from the Data Controller, where appropriate, access to their personal data as well as rectification or erasure of such data or the restriction of the processing concerning them, and to object to the processing (pursuant to Articles 15 to 22 of the Regulation).

If you believe that your rights under the GDPR have been violated, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority.
